Sensory Processing Disorder

Patient Symptoms

- Difficulty paying attention, following directions, and/or poor eye contact
- Hyper/hyposensitive to various textures to hands, feet and/or mouth
- Low tone
- Difficulty with coloring, cutting or writing
- Appears clumsy, frequent falls
- Hyper/hyposensitive to movement stimuli such as swings or merry-go-rounds
- Common dual diagnoses
 - Autism
 - Asperger's Syndrome
 - Cerebral Palsy
 - Mental retardation
 - Premature infants
 - PDD
 - Down Syndrome
 - TBI
 - ADD/ADHD

Occupational Therapy Intervention

- Sensory Integration evaluation
- Developmental evaluation (one-on-one sensory integration-based treatment provided in a quiet and organized setting. Focus areas of treatment include:
 - Sensory Processing
 - Visual-motor skills training
 - Attention to task, self-regulation and sequencing
 - Visual perceptual skills training
 - Bilateral coordination skills training
 - Desensitization
 - ADL performance enhancement
 - Sensory diet home program and school recommendation
 - Upper body strengthening

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*Only treat adult patients
