- ☞ Call 704-355-3333 if you have any security concerns or issues.
- ☞ Keep personal items and system equipment in a secure area. Unlocked doors or purses/book bags left in classrooms invite theft.
- ☞ If you see a visitor who needs assistance, please direct them to the front desk to obtain a visitor badge while they are here.
- ☞ Politely, but firmly, challenge individuals in and around your work area if they seem suspicious or do not have proper identification. Contact security if the person refuses to answer your question, becomes agitated, or chooses not to cooperate.
- ☞ Contact security for assistance with escorts, directions or setting up security education programs.

Mary Parkman, Faculty, Radiation Therapy program, and her husband and daughter will be welcoming a new baby in early November.




## Compliance Corner

This month's Compliance Corner highlights changes implemented to reduce infections caused by indwelling urinary catheters, one of the National Patient Safety Goals set by the Joint Commission. CMC is now using new Foley catheter kits called Bardex I.C. Complete Care kits. The new kits, available on clean supply carts at CMC Main, differ from the previous kits in that the catheters are treated with patented Bard materials which evidence has shown reduces the incidence of urinary tract infections in catheterized patients. Included in the kit are castile soap towelettes for perineal preparation, povidone iodine swab sticks for meatal cleaning, an alcohol gel pack for hand care for the provider post insertion, and a label sheet to validate the indication and tracking of indwelling catheters, necessary for proper patient documentation. The label directly follows CDC guidelines for appropriate indications for catheter use, and prompts the practitioner to validate use. Be on the look-out for new Bardex I.C. Complete Care catheter kits.
