Questions for the Surgeon

What is the name of the type of breast cancer I have?

How large is the tumor? Is the tumor in-situ or invasive?

Do you expect cancer cells to be found in my lymph nodes?

Do you expect the cancer has invaded anything else such as skin, muscle, bones, other organs?)

Is there evidence on my mammogram that there might be cancer anywhere else in this breast or in the opposite breast?

Will I have to have surgery? If so, what type do you recommend?

Why do you recommend that type of surgery?

What can I expect to look like after surgery?

Will lumpectomy give me the same chance for control of my cancer as mastectomy?

Am I candidate for sentinel node biopsy? Do you perform sentinel node biopsies?

Will my cosmetic results be acceptable?

Will I have drains after surgery?

Will I go home with drains?

When do you expect the drains to be removed?

Is the surgery outpatient or will I be hospitalized? If so, for how long?
